The PENTA Building Group was recently ranked 95th on Engineering News-Record's 2009 list of the nation's top 400 contractors. The ranking lists the country's largest general contractors by 2008 revenue. It is a comprehensive package of data and analysis that contains the previous year's rankings and percentage of revenue by market. The magazine also ranked the largest firms in a variety of market sectors, as well as a statistical summary of the top 400 by their markets and regions. PENTA advanced on this year's list with revenues of \$690 million. The company ranked at 103 on the 2008 list, based on its 2007 revenue of \$600 million.

“PENTA has come a long way since we founded it nearly nine years ago,” said Ken Alber, Vice President of The PENTA Building Group. “Breaking into the nation’s top 100 is a satisfying milestone.”
